The generosity of the people who live in this village continues in abundance to support St Andrew's Church and the appeal for the restoration of the roof.

On 26 October there was a full house for the night of "Rat Racing" which raised a grand total of £1,081, an evening that everyone seemed to enjoy. This was followed shortly by the "Christmas Upcycle Sale" particularly for the roof, the income from which, including donations, amounted to £622.50. So far, up to the end of October, the Roof Fund has received a total of £5,183.90 including donations, of which £1,536 has been spent on the detailed inspection of the tower fabric.

We are extremely grateful for all the support we receive.

The Council welcomes Kevin Mellor and Douglas Carr as new members. Council work couldn't have been that bad as this is the second stint for Kevin! There is one seat still available for co-option. Please contact the Clerk or Chairman if interested.

Please be aware that the recent flooding has made the use of the Parish Wharf facilities such as the steps to the river and the seat dangerous. Please avoid using these parts of the Wharf and any other sections deemed unsafe as determined by personal inspection.

There have been reports of vehicles blocking Hoden Lane during school drop off/pick up times. The Council reminds parishioners that parking is available on the Garage forecourt, the slip road between Main St and the Garage and near the Memorial Hall. Please remember that large vehicles need access.

The refusal of planning application 18/01727/OU (land off Haywood Way) has been appealed. The Council objected to this application for a proposed change of use as a residential caravan site for six Gypsy/Traveller families each with two caravans and erection of six utility buildings. All representations made to WDC have been forwarded to the Planning Inspectorate. The Council will be submitting further representations in regard to the appeal.

The Council set its 2020-21 Budget. The highlights include:

Precept remains unchanged at £22,000

- Revenue (non-reserve allocated) expenditure: £18,365
- Forecasted Full Year 19-20 Reserves: £34,607
- Legal Fees (planning application battles?) is the highest risk item: £9,700 reserves
- Playground reserves £10,000
- Full Year 20 - 21 Forecast Balance of £41,952

I am sad to report that our Lengthsman has resigned. The search for a replacement has only just commenced, however, if any parishioner is interested and wants to know more about the position, please contact the Clerk. The position pays £15 per hour for up to 10.5 hours per month.

Through the efforts of Cllr Smith, the Council made the final three of the Wychavon District Council Village of Culture competition. This comes with a £1000 donation to support Cleeve Prior's Cultural Programme. Should the Council be placed first, the prize is increased to £5000. Keep your fingers crossed and be sure to congratulate Cllr Smith when you next see her.

The South Worcestershire Development Plan is currently out for consultation. This "Preferred Options" consultation sets out the Council's draft policies and identifies those sites which could possibly be developed for housing etc. Cleeve Prior has been potentially earmarked for a 5 dwelling site off Main St between Nut Tree and Kemises House. Orchard Planting Project

We Need Your Help!

Saturdays 7 and 14 December, 10am to 1pm

As part of our grant scheme with Natural England, we are extending the Orchard by the Hovel. Part of this involves clearing a patch of scrub 75m by 20m so that we can plant 44 fruit trees in two rows. We need help to carry out the following jobs:

Scrub Clearance

Dense growth of old bramble/ briar/ creepers has to be cleared to get access to the young trees and saplings which are too big to be cleared by the tractor flail.

Tree Felling

The small trees have to be taken down to ground level so we can manage the regrowth with the mowers.

Felling of 12 large trees and prepare them for chipping . The branches to be removed, cut into lengths and stacked for chipping later.

Once the trees are felled we need to excavate to 3 inches along one side of the stumps so we can chain saw them off to ground level.

Bonfire

There is some hawthorn which may need to be burnt as horrible to handle.

Meet at top car park, Field Barn. Please wear stout boots and clothing. Thick gloves and eye protectors if you have them. We have a good supply if you don't have any. We have loppers, saws, shears and secateurs, but if you have your favourite please bring. Knowing our events please bring waterproofs!!! WE will of course provide hot and cold drinks/ biscuits.

Please put this date in your diary and come along to help develop and maintain your Community Orchard. It's a good opportunity for those of you who work to come along and help on a Saturday morning.

On 6 November we had an excellent talk from Harry Green - the Head Gardener of Morton Hall. After an initial brief history of the garden he gave us a month by month insight into the general maintenance required for the upkeep of the gardens.

A few of the many useful tips were: planting lime nicotiana amongst pastel shades is very effective in lifting colour; pruning roses in January to prevent damage to later emerging tulip bulbs;sprinkling chilli powder on top of compost and under a layer of gravel in tulip pots is a great squirrel deterrent.

A Tulip Festival will be held at Morton Hall on May 2, 3 and 4, 2020, which I can thoroughly recommend visiting
